If in doubt or unsure about your travel options contact your local Community Transport Group whose phone number is located on the 'Summary' page.

Public Transport is designed mainly to move large numbers of people as efficiently as possible.

Public transport can provide benefits such as:

- Out of hours transport, including nights and on weekends: and
- Concession fares, like those offered by CountryLink. Public transport is becoming more accessible, with ramps, elevators and low-floor vehicles, making it available to wheelchair users and people with mobility aids.

Community Transport Groups across NSW provide personalised transport services that cater to the needs of:

- The frail, elderly and their carers;
- Younger persons who cannot use their regular forms of transport;
- Residents who are isolated due to lack of available transport options.

Community Transport aims to ensure transport is available and accessible by:

- Linking people to available services; and
- Providing personalised door-to-door services for those in need.

Across NSW, Community Transport Groups provide services using mini-buses and cars as well as working in partnership with local bus and taxi operators.
